

Grieg, a victim of a challenging childhood, has been living on and off the streets of Courtenay for about 20 years. He receives \$375 a month in social assistance to use towards housing and he has been diagnosed with schizophrenia, which he can manage with medication, but he also has challenges with alcohol addiction. He has been evicted from apartments in the past, and has trouble living with roommates. Grieg and his support worker recognize that he needs to live in a safe space with on-site support to help him with his day-to-day life skills.

There are no units of supportive housing in the Comox Valley and there are wait lists to get into supportive housing in other communities like Nanaimo and Victoria. Grieg has no other option but to continue to sleep in a tent while trying to manage his mental health and substance use challenges.
